Synopsis

This episode of Re-Imagined Radio presents four short science fiction radio stories written and directed by Jack J. Ward, who founded and co-hosts *The Sonic Society*, a weekly podcast from Halifax, Nova Scotia, that showcases new audio dramas. He also founded and directs Mutual Audio Network, perhaps the world's largest collection and distribution platform for podcasts, radio and audio stories and dramas of all genres. This selection showcases Ward's broad range and diversity of creative ideas.

PELEGRINE Hey, where can I get one of those flame-box symbols?

SFX: SITTING IN CHAIRS. WORKING ON SEAT BELTS

TAGGART This? Oh... you have to be able to spend some time with the Beathomat. Learn their ways somewhat...

PELEGRINE Yeah?

SFX: PUNCHING BUTTONS. LOKI'S ENGINES WARMING UP.

TAGGART (HALF TO HIMSELF)

Interesting peoples. Do you know they believe that the soul is undying and sacred?

PELEGRINE Is that what they mean by "Eternity Ethereals"?

TAGGART Yeah. It means all beings in the universe have a responsibility for not just our own souls, but to protect the souls of others...

PELEGRINE (LAUGHS DERISIVELY)

Come on. Primitive peoples...

Whatchagonna do? (CHUCKLES) Loki rocket ready for lift off. Stand by...

TAGGART

Yep. (SMILING) Primitive peoples... Standing by...

PELEGRINE

Retro rockets online. Firing mains...

SFX: ROCKETS FIRING AND ROCKET LIFTING OFF

ANNOUNCER

The responsibility of all living souls, making their way across the ebon curtain of night on their way home . . .

SFX: THEME MUSIC UP, ROCKET STREAKS ACROSS SOUND STAGE.

ANNOUNCER

Retro Rockets is an anthology series based on the explorations of science fiction from the Golden Age for a new audience . . .

SFX: THEME MUSIC UP, ROCKET SOUNDS.

Spirit Drive was written and directed by Jack J. Ward. Starring Jeff Billard as Captain Pelegrine, Tom Konkle as Professor Beardley, and with Joe Stofko as Special Ranger Taggert. This episode was produced by John Bell. I am your host, Lothar Tuppan. Good night.

ANNOUNCER

Welcome to Re-Imagined Radio, a program about radio storytelling. I'm Jack Armstrong. With each episode we combine dialogue, sound effects, and music to engage your listening imagination. This episode is no different, and here to tell you about it is John Barber, producer and host.

HOST OPEN

HOST

Thank you Jack. Hello everyone. Welcome.

With this episode of Re-Imagined Radio, we present four short science fiction radio stories by Jack J. Ward, each in the style of the famous *X Minus One* series. You heard a nod to that series with the rocket launch sequence in our episode opening, sampled from the pilot of Ward's audio drama series "Spirit Drive."

Jack lives on the East Coast of Canada, in Halifax, Nova Scotia.

We call this episode "Coast to Coast," to signify that Jack and his stories come to us here on the WEST Coast of the United States from the EAST Coast of Canada.

Our episode originates from KXRW-FM. Vancouver, Washington's community radio

station. We thank them for their support.

And we thank YOU for joining us as Re-Imagined Radio presents "Coast to Coast: Jack J. Ward's Radio Storytelling."

DRAMATIC TRANSITION

HOST

Jack J. Ward is an award-winning writer, director, actor, and producer of audio drama. His works of fantasy, comedy, horror, drama, classic suspense, and experimental theatre are prolific. See our website for more information.

Jack is also a tireless promoter of audio drama. In 2005, he started "The Sonic Society," a weekly podcast showcasing new audio dramas. Co-hosted by Ward and David Ault, The Sonic Society is the largest and longest running showcase of contemporary international audio dramas.

Ward also founded Mutual Audio Network, with nearly a dozen other audio drama writers and producers, in 2019, as, he says, "a cluster of podcasts about audio drama, audio fiction, and nerd culture." Ward directs the effort, and hosts several of its podcasts.

So, Jack J. Ward is a busy, and productive, person in the world of radio storytelling. When he called, from Nova Scotia, Canada, saying he heard Re-

Imagined Radio and wanted it for his Sonic Society, well . . . as you can imagine . . . we were excited!

In return, we asked Jack to send samples of his own radio stories. He did, and we picked four.

First up is "Galaxy Master versus the Varn." In this story, a Hollywood movie actor, who plays "Galaxy Master," is abducted by the Varn, aliens who feel his portrayal of the galaxy's leading villain eclipses their own reputation. Let's listen.

You're listening to Re-Imagined Radio. Our episode is "Coast to Coast," four radio stories by Jack J. Ward. We just listened to "Galaxy Master versus the Varn."

Next is "Reservations." Jack's imagination really shines here. After death, he imagines people waiting at a nice restaurant before their final destinations, heaven or hell, are decided. But, for one guest, the decision is complicated by time travel. Let's listen to "Reservations."

HOST That was "Reservations" by Jack J. Ward. It's an interesting idea--right?--that after death, one enjoys a meal at a nice restaurant, located in a tall building, while waiting to hear whether you ascend to the penthouse, or descend to the basement?

MUSIC: RIR BREAK THEME

BREAK #1--THE FUSEBOX BREAK

HOST You're listening to Re-Imagined Radio. This is John Barber, producer and host. We'll return to our episode in just a moment. But first I want to introduce The Fusebox Show . . . radio storytelling, full of quirky conversation and comedy you're not likely to hear in a nice restaurant. Here's a sample . . .

HOST This is Re-Imagined Radio. Our episode is "Coast to Coast." We're featuring four radio stories by Jack J. Ward, based in Halifax, Nova Scotia, Canada, at the eastern edge of the country. Hence our title, "Coast to Coast," since Re-Imagined Radio originates in

Vancouver, Washington, at the western edge of the United States.

Let's listen now to "Alien Invasion Cancelled." In this radio story, Ward asks, "What if aliens decide not to help Earthers because the effort would not be valued on social media?"

HOST

That was "Alien Invasion Cancelled" by Jack J. Ward. You heard it here, on Re-Imagined Radio. This episode is called "Coast to Coast" and features radio stories by Ward.

We've got time for one more radio story. This one is called "Trans-Humanity." It's about the last woman on Earth and her resistance to being incorporated into the cloud.

SFX: RECORDED ACTUALITY, "TRANS-
HUMANITY," BY JACK J. WARD. APPROX.
TIME: 15:29
